------LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS ------

STRENNA - 2019 - So That My Joy May Be In You (Jn. 15: 11) Holiness for you, too.....

Our beloved Rector Major Fr. Ángel Fernandez Artime goes on to say that the presentation of the Strenna 2019 "is a magnificent opportunity to be in harmony with the summons the Holy Father addresses in the Apostolic Gaudete et exsultate, which has much to do with our Salesian charism. Don Bosco was a great teacher in this sense, with the ability to inspire and accompany his children on the paths of daily holiness." The document presented to the Salesian world consists of nine paragraphs. In the seventh, the Rector Major insists on an essential reality of holiness and he does it through a question: "what does 'holiness for you too' mean?" It is an exciting topic that this question offers, and even more exciting is the answer to each of the Salesian Family members. "Holiness is not an "extra", an optional and a goal only for some. It is life to the full, according to God's plan and gift. It is therefore a path of humanization." Daily sanctity has become a reality in the lives lived to the full in the Salesian charism. "What is important is to be holy, not to be declared as such," emphasizes the Rector Major. "The canonized saints are like the façade of a church; but the church contains many precious treasures inside, which however remain invisible."



St. Francis Xavier was one of the co-founders of the Jesuits (Society of Jesus), along with St. Ignatius of Loyola, Blessed Peter Favre, and four other men. The Jesuits focused on evangelization throughout the world, and also participated in the Counter-Reformation. Because of their vow of obedience and willingness to spread the Word to remote areas of the world, Francis Xavier was sent first to the Portuguese areas in India. His first foreign mission as a Jesuit was to reform and strengthen the Catholic virtues which were seen to be in decline among the people there. Francis Xavier was a missionary extraordinaire. He is widely regarded as the greatest missionary since St. Paul due to the sheer number of people he converted and lands he traveled. Francis Xavier took the message of Christ to the East into areas that had little to no experience with Christianity before. In a short span of only 10 years from 1542 - 1552, Francis Xavier managed to visit multiple countries; his estimated number of converts during that time are in the 40,000 - 50,000 people. As Francis reached his decision, the text of Genesis 12:1 crossed his mind: "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you." That verse gave him a prophetic inkling of the unanticipated direction his life would take. He did this extraordinary service for the Church, and for this, he is named the "Apostle of the Indies" and Patron of the Propagation of Faith and foreign missions. Let his life be an inspiration for all of us.



BL. PHILIP RINALDI -5th

Bl. Phillip Rinaldi was born on May 28, 1856 in Piedmont, Italy. He met Don Bosco when he was just five years old and intuitively recognized that he was a man with a great mission.

At the age of 22, he entered the Salesian Order at the end of a tremendous vocational struggle, and even before making his vows he was made assistant novice master and was placed in charge of those with late vocations. He was ordained a priest in 1882. He soon became the Salesian provincial superior in Spain, where he opened many new houses and then served as vicar-general of the Salesians before becoming the Rector Major in 1922, Don Bosco's third successor. His humble and quiet leadership of the order – he preferred to remain in the background of events, unnoticed in the crowd -- combined with his tremendous saintly virtue and apostolic zeal, and a healing miracle attributed to him at the end of the Second World War, prompted his cause for canonization. He died on December 5, 1931 in Turin, and was beatified on April 29, 1990 by Pope John Paul II. "What must you do to have life? Before all else, the first thing you have to do is pray for courage every day to carry the cross the Lord has assigned you. Then let each of you do your own work really well, the work proper to your state, as God wants it, and according to your condition." - Blessed Philip Rinaldi. May God grant us the grace to acquire the same spirit of Bl. Philip Rinadi and let us also offer our prayers for the volunteers of Don Bosco on their feast day.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - 8th

Mary was granted this extraordinary privilege because of Her unique role in history as the Mother of God. That is, She received the gift of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception.
