My dearest Sisters, affectionate Greetings from the Provincial House Bangalore!

Mary teaches her children to hope in life's darkest moments (Pope Francis)

We have entered in to this beautiful month of our Blessed Mother Mary Help of Christians, A month dear to every Salesian vocation. For our constitution Article 4 says, Mary most Holy inspired our Institute and continues to be its mother and teacher, we are, therefore 'a religious Family that belongs entirely to Mary".

Mary, like many mothers throughout the world, is an example of strength and courage in accepting new life and in sharing the sufferings of her children. Although she had no idea of what awaited her when she accepted to bear God's son, "Mary in that instant appears to us like one of the many mothers in our world, courageous to the extreme," said the Pontiff.

Her motherly love and courage is seen again at the foot of the cross, he said, where "she teaches us the virtue of waiting even when everything appears meaningless."

"We are not orphans, we have a mother in heaven," he said. "In difficult moments, in the time of pandemic, death, vulnerability and insecurity may Mary, the mother that Jesus has given to us all, always guide our steps and protect us from all harm."

The Gospels portray Mary mostly as a "woman of silence," but one who "meditated on every word and every event in her heart," the pope said. "She is not a woman who is depressed in front of the uncertainties of life, especially when nothing seems to be going right. Instead, she is a woman who listens."

Continuing his series of talks on Christian hope, Pope Francis reflected on Mary as "the mother of hope.""Don't forget: There is always a great relationship between hope and listening. And Mary is a woman who listens, who welcomes existence as it comes to us with its happy days as well as its tragedies, which we never want to encounter," he said. Mary's silence in the Gospel, the pope continued, is particularly evident in Jesus' final moments where her presence during Christ's passion is "eclipsed" until "she reappears at a crucial moment: when a good number of friends vanished because of fear."

"Mothers do not betray, and in that instance, at the foot of the cross, none of us can say which one was the crueller passion: that of the innocent man who dies on the scaffold of the cross or the agony of a mother who accompanies her son in his final moments of life," he said. Mary, he added, was "there" not just out of

faithfulness to God's divine plan but also because "of her instinct as a mother who just suffers" every time her child does.

We are indeed living in a very difficult and doubtful period. Our life is blurred and full of anxiety, insecure and terrifying. We have come to a situation where we can no more depend on human power. God is the only one who can have control over our life. What we need is to strengthen the virtues of faith and hope and Our Blessed Mother Mary, the Help of Christians, the Mother of Hope and Mercy can assist us in this attempt, because she lived it in her life.

Our Institute is Don Bosco's living monument of gratitude, designed and built as a lasting tribute to Our blessed lady. Each of us is a stone in the living monument which by all means gives beauty and shape to this memorial tribute. God has designed this time of pain, and uncertainty to experience a little more deep the protection of heaven. We are never sure of tomorrow. As we begin preparing ourselves for the greatest feast let us consciously imitate our Mother and find strength in the fidelity of God like her.

FEAST OF MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS

Historically we know that it was Pius VII who instituted the Feast of Mary Help of Christians on May 24, in 1815, recalling the victory at Lepanto and commemorating the day of his own release, the year prior,



from imprisonment at the hands of Napoleon. Don Bosco championed the devotion to Mary Help of Christians. Let us continue to have recourse to this devotion to Mary Help of Christians in our disturbed and gloomy times especially during this time of strong second wave of Corona Virus. Let us extend our prayers for the whole world praying fervently the novena to Mary Help of Christians and celebrating the feast in a worthy manner.

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Pentecost event is indeed one of the most significant mysteries of our Catholic faith. It is the definitive establishing of the Church; it is the beginning of the mission of preaching and evangelization for the Church. It established the community of Jesus' disciples as the sacrament of salvation, the amazing continuation of the presence, teaching, healing, power and grace of Jesus among us until the end of time. With the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost Jesus,



our Savior and Redeemer is made present among in a more powerful and extensive manner that was

possible during his mortal life. The Holy Spirit is the spirit of the risen Jesus. Such, is the meaning and importance of the Pentecostal event some twenty centuries ago. THE EXPERIENCE OF THE EPIDEMIC IN MARY DOMENICA MAZZARELLO

For the vast majority of us, the reality of an epidemic is a new condition, all the more so since it manifests itself in the form of a pandemic, but Mary Domenica Mazzarello knew the consequences of the epidemics at **an early age**. Her parents had welcomed as their daughter another Mary Domenica, a cousin, from whom cholera had taken away her parents in 1835. The inhabitants of her hamlet were building the church of Saints Stephen and Lorenzo and Mary Help of Christians in thanksgiving for the protection received on that same occasion. But then she **experienced an epidemic in**

her own person. It was the time of total oblation in charity and obedience: 'Fr. Pestarino, if you want, I will go. But I am sure I will get sick.' But, at the same time, without being able to even imagine it, this was a decisive choice for her life and ... for us, for the Institute that would be born after several years. What could seem to be a failure, that brought with it the collapse of plans and hopes, revealed itself instead, over time, to be the key to access the providential and unthinkable design of God.

THE BEGINNING OF EVERYTHING...

What might have seemed the end of everything was instead, the beginning of everything. God not only wanted her as a peasant, engaged in her parish, available to be a catechist also to mothers, but an **apostle of the female youth world**, through Christian education. It was not entirely clear to her immediately, far from it. **From the prayer** 'Lord, if in your goodness you want to grant me a few more years of life, let me spend them ignored by all, and, except by You, forgotten by all', to the vision of Borgo Alto, to the **decision to learn how to be a seamstress** to gather and educate the girls of the town in a Christian way. Thus a whole **path of docility to the Spirit** is outlined, which only shows her one step at a time what God wants from her, which stimulates her ability to look around, to see needs, and to plan answers ... but always with **the gaze of her heart on God alone.**

I ENTRUST THEM TO YOU..., STILL TODAY

This is a great **suggestion** for us at this time, in which all our homes do not resonate, as usual, with youthful voices, in which we are inventing new ways of reaching, animating, educating children and adolescents, of involving the young people in this mission.

What are the Lord and Mary Help of Christians asking of us? What face should our mission take now and when will we meet again physically? What do they want to change in our life and in our support of life that grows?

We know only one thing with certainty: that Our Lady's appeal, 'I entrust them to you', continues to resonate in our hearts as individuals and as a community, and as an educating community, as an Institute. Being 'communities that generate life' means knowing how to arouse life where there seems to be only death; hope where the temptation is to refuse even the possibility of dreaming of a better future; trust where mistrust risks taking over.

To awaken the **vocational freshness** of the origins is to help open our hearts and ears to the **appeals** that reach us from all sides and ask us to know how to 'invent the tools' to respond to them, to give a decisive turn to the choices to put ourselves **at the service** of those in need.

ST. JOSEPH A MAN OF ACTION

While the Gospels do not record any words Saint Joseph might have spoken, the eloquent silence nonetheless allows us a glimpse into his character. Righteous, Obedient, Pure, Humble, Silent (contemplative) Husband, Protector and guardian of the Saviour and the Blessed Virgin. Saint Joseph experienced the same difficulties in life we all do, yet he lived an exemplary life. Saint Joseph was a man possessed of unwavering faith and utmost trust in God's providence. God was first and foremost, above all, in Saint Joseph's life. In short, he is an upright man of faith and outstanding virtues. As such, he serves as a wonderful role model for us today.

For Saint Joseph, doing God's will was paramount. Saint Joseph never questioned what God told him and carried out God's promptings without hesitation or delay – his response was immediate and he would carry out the task at hand the way God wanted it done. After the angel appeared to him in a dream, assuring him

that Mary's child was conceived through the Holy Spirit, Joseph took Mary into his home as his wife. After the visit of the magi, upon receiving the angel's warning, Joseph wasted no time, immediately getting up and taking his little family and fleeing to Egypt in the middle of the night to escape King Herod's murderous wrath. Later, after Herod's death, the angel again instructed Joseph that it was time to return to the land of Israel, and while he probably intended to return to Bethlehem in Judea, chose rather to go to Nazareth in Galilee upon being warned by the angel that Herod's son ruled Judea in his place. When God told Joseph to get up and go, Joseph unhesitatingly got up and went.

Saint Joseph was a man of action, obeying God's will for him in the ordinary duties of daily life. He faithfully and tenderly loved, protected and provided for the Child Jesus and the Virgin Mary. He kept the Sabbath and went to the Temple in Jerusalem for the Passover. He did the ordinary things of everyday, ordinary life with love.

By following Saint Joseph's example, let us faithfully do the ordinary, little things that God wants us to do.
