#### SACRED HEART OF JESUS - PATRON OF OUR PROVINCE

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus presents us with the opportunity to reflect on the relevance of this venerable symbol in our daily lives. The image of the Sacred Heart is never mentioned as such in Sacred Scripture, but its significance can be found spanning each page from Genesis to Revelation. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast. *St. John Paul II*, a great devotee of the Sacred Heart, said, *"This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all times."* 

In 2023, we celebrate the *Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 16*. Let us take a moment to reflect upon the Sacred Heart through the adapted thoughts of *St. Aquinas*. Human being cannot live without joy; therefore when a person is deprived of true spiritual joys she/he becomes addicted to carnal pleasures. Joy is compared to desire as rest to movement. Rest is full when there is no more movement. Hence joy is full when there remains nothing to be desired. But as long as we are in this world, the movement of desire does not cease in us. However, when once perfect happiness has been attained, nothing will remain to be desired because then there will be full enjoyment of God, wherein we will obtain whatever we had desired even with regard to other goods (Ps102:5). Hence desire will be at rest, not only our desire for God but all our desire, so that the joy of the blessed is full to perfection- indeed, over-full, since they will obtain more than they were capable of desiring (1Cor2:9). Yet, this perfectly full joy is not taken into; on the

contrary, we enter into it, according to *Mt 25: 21 "Enter into the joy of thy Lord"*. This joy is the fullness of His heart, the Sacred Heart.

Let us prepare ourselves daily to enter into this heart of Joy. In the ordinary moments of our lives, the simple as much as the spectacular, and the majestic as well as the everyday, may we be transformed by the knowledge that each moment and events of life are opportunities to transform ourselves to the austere demands of Christ's love which requires self conquest and self gift. Let us grow in our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Patron of our Province and carry on spreading this devotion through the First Friday practices in our communities.

Let us listen also to what *Pope Francis* tells us: "Do not be afraid to present to Jesus all the intentions of our suffering humanity, its fears, and its miseries. May this Heart, full of love for humanity, give everyone hope and trust." Let us discover the riches that are hidden in the Heart of Jesus.

## CONCLUSION

The Sacred Heart of Jesus ushers us into the 31st year in the life of our Province. It's time to ask ourselves: *Is our Province vibrant with the flame of love for Jesus and with the zeal for the "holistic education" of our vibrant millennial youth?* As we enter into the new academic year, it is useful to reflect on what the Church expects from us. Our charism urges us to: "Evangelization through Education"- integral human education. The concept of integral education does not focus only on the knowledge, in other words only on the growth of intellect. It involves the combination of six elements of human growth: Physiology, Psychology, Rationality, Emotion, Intellect and Spirituality. Thus human maturity is reached where one learns to live for oneself, others and for God. Pope Francis puts it in a nutshell, that is, 'education should focus on the growth of *head, heart and hand*'; that is to say, an education that integrates and harmonizes intellect, affections and activity." Therefore, we should not be satisfied with only academic excellence and good results but also the integral formation of the person.

*Msgr. S. Jayanathan* the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Bangalore in his article on 'Catholic Church and Mission of Education' explains the nature of the Catholic education and the demands of the Church from the Canon Law point of view. He delineates the five specific duties of Catholic education, under the title *"Five Essential Marks of Catholic schools."* 

1. Parents are the first educators of their children. It is good to remind them of this duty.

**2.** The Church is bound as a mother to give to these children of hers an education by which their whole life can be imbued with the spirit of Christ.

**3.** Animated by Communion and Community, emphasizing on the community aspect of the Catholic schools. The Catholic school is an educational community of persons, even more to the point, a 'genuine community of faith'.

**4.** *Imbued with a Catholic World view.* Catholicism should permeate not just the class period of catechism or religious education, or the school's pastoral activities, but the entire curriculum. The Vatican documents speak of an integral education, which responds to all the needs of the human person.

#### **5.** Sustained by the Witness of Teaching

The primary responsibility in ensuring a school's Catholic identity and for creating a unique Christian school climate lies with the teachers. Theirs is a calling and not simply the exercise of a profession. Educators at every level in the Church are expected to be models for their students by bearing transparent witness to the Gospel.

My dear Sisters, Let us be happy and feel privileged for having been called by the Lord to fulfill such a noble mission in the Church. Therefore, let us put our whole heart and soul into our calling as educators. A construction engineer works with bricks and mortar; an accountant with numbers; a doctor and nurse have to deal with patients. Instead, we educators have before us the cream of human society, the tender buds which we have to help bloom into beautiful flowers.... Ours is a happy, joyful and noble vocation!
