My dearest Sisters, Prayerful and affectionate Greetings from the Provincial House Bangalore!

I am back in the Province with many good wishes and loving greetings from our Mother General, the General Councillors and in particular Sr. Celine Jacob. I had a relaxed and fruitful time in Rome and Castelgandolfo. I thank each one of you for your loving and prayerful accompaniment during my journey and stay at the Centre.

I cannot proceed in writing this Circular without remembering our dear Sr. Lizy K. Varkey, whom the Lord of Life came to pluck during my absence. He prepared her through suffering, and finally, on July 7th, Sr. Lizy took her flight serenely and peacefully to her eternal aboard. On the 5th morning, she spoke to me on the phone and thanked me, assuring me of her prayers and offerings for the needs of the Province. As I followed her funeral rites online, I did thank God for Sr. Shiji Kurian and the Community of Puthuppally for lovingly accompanying Sr. Lizy during the time of her intense suffering. Sr. Lily Arangassery and Sr. Alice Philip were by her side with all the possible nursing care. I thank Sr. Sheela Jacob and the Community of Kottiyam for arranging everything for the last rites for dear Sr. Lizy. Special thanks to Sr. Annie John and Sr. Sini Varghese for being there.

We begin another important month. August is not just the eighth month of the year; it also describes something esteemed or regal. The month of August was named for Augustus Caesar, who was an important and regal person. For us Indians, it's significant because it brings to our minds the event most important to our Nation: Independence Day, and for us Catholics, also the feast of the Assumption of our Mother Mary.

151 Anniversary of the Foundation of the Institute

August 5, the Feast of Our Lady of Snow, a significant moment in the annals of the Institute, continues till today to sing together with joy the wonders of Mary in the life of our institute and in the life of each one of us. We recall to our minds our first sisters of Mornese, together with our Saintly Co-Foundress Mary Mazzarello, who pronounced their "Yes" forever on the day that marked the foundation. We also marvel at our Six FMA Pioneers who came to India in 1922, sixteen years after the Salesian charism was brought to our beloved motherland, (by the Salesians) India. The FMA augmented in number, the mission grew, and the province too increased to seven. All because of Mother Mary's intervention!

In 1854, Italy experienced a devastating cholera epidemic with a death rate of up to 60%. St. Don Bosco advised his pupils to avoid sin, pray, and wear a blessed Marian medal. On August 5, Don Bosco spoke about Our Lady of the Snows' intercession in combating the disease and her advocacy as the Mother of Mercy. He advised them to make a good confession and receive Holy Communion and to remain in a state of grace to avoid being stricken by the disease. Don Bosco and his priests took care for the local victims, involving over 40 of his boys in nursing and caring for the sick and dying. Despite the challenges, the boys persevered and eventually recovered.

The best antidote to the cessation of violence in Manipur is to remain in a state of grace, pray with fervour, and have genuine devotion to the Blessed Virgin. May we also practise Don Bosco's words and intensify our prayers for the state of Manipur.

MARY'S ASSUMPTION & INDEPENDENCE DAY OF INDIA

The Assumption completes God's work in Mary since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of His work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over. The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they do not look only to the past. They look to the present and to the future and give us an insight into our own relationship with God. The Assumption looks to eternity and gives us hope that we, too, will follow Our Lady when our life is ended.



As we celebrate Independence Day, we gratefully remember our patriotic leaders and the people. This day questions us, as all of us are aware of the situation through which India is passing now.

We go back to the midnight of August 14, 1947: in his historic speech, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, said: "At the stroke of the midnight hour, when the world sleeps, India will awaken to life and freedom. A moment comes, which comes but rarely in history, when we step out from the old to the new". His ambition has been to wipe away every tear from every eye. That may be beyond us, but so long as there are tears and suffering, our work will not be over. And so we have to labour and work to give reality to our dreams.

On that August 15th, Mahatma Gandhi did not celebrate but observed a 24-hour fast, offered prayers, and spun Khadi yarn. He wrote: "My way of celebrating great events, such as today's, is to thank God for them and, therefore, to pray." He knew that that day contained seeds of conflict between India and Pakistan. Riots between Hindus and Muslims were in the air in Calcutta, Lahore and several other places. He travelled to the trouble-torn places and met the people. Within a few days, peace returned. Referring to Mahatma Gandhi's efforts in Kolkata, Lord Mountbatten wrote, "In Punjab, we have 55,000 soldiers and large-scale rioting on our hands. In Bengal, our forces consist of ONE MAN, and there is no rioting." ... Power of Prayer and Fasting! of a single man, Mahatma Gandhi!

If just one man's prayer and sacrifices could bring about such drastic changes in such a short time, what cannot our 34 communities achieve with regard to the problems the Church in India is facing now? Let us not give up hope; prayer and sacrifices will bear fruit and India will become a place,

Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high, where knowledge is free.

Where the world has not been broken up
Into fragments by narrow domestic walls.

Where words come out from the depth of truth, where tireless striving stretches its arms toward perfection.

Where the clear stream of reason has not lost its way into the dreary desert sand of dead habit.

Where the mind is led forward by thee into ever widening thought and action.

In to that haven of freedom, my father,
Let my country awake.

"A GLANCE AT THE CRUCIFIX GIVES ME THE STRENGTH AND THE COURAGE TO WORK."

This was the secret of the heroic missionary life of Blessed Maria Troncatti.

Born in Cortegno Golgi, Italy, Sr. Maria Troncatti was a hardworking and religious woman who attended catechism in her parish. She attended the Institute of the Salesian Sisters and made her first profession in 1908. During World War I, she took a course in health care and worked as a Red Cross nurse. She then went to Ecuador in 1922 to work with the Shuar people, evangelizing them against dangers like forest beasts and fast-flowing rivers. Sr. Maria's work, including nursing, surgery, orthopedics, dentists, and anesthetists, was a testament to her faith, patience, and fraternal love. Her work led to the formation of hundreds of new Christian families, allowing young couples to

form their own Christian families. Sr. Maria died in a tragic air crash at Sucúa on August 25, 1969. Her remains lie at Macas, in the Province of Morona (Ecuador). The Servant of God, Sister Maria Troncatti, was raised to the glory of the Blessed in Macas (Ecuador) on November 24, 2012. As we keep her memory let us imitate her testimony of faith and ardent love for God and our neighbour in our daily living.
