

World Drug Day 2023

Drug abuse and illicit trafficking continue to pose a significant threat to individuals, families, and communities worldwide. The consequences of drug abuse are far-reaching, leading to deteriorating health, broken relationships, and a loss of productivity. In order to raise essential awareness about the devastating effects of drug abuse, every year June 26 is celebrated as the International day against drug abuse and illicit trafficking.

On the occasion of International Day Against Drug Abuse, an orientation class by Mr. Bijoy



Srambical, Director and Cousellor of Paravur counselling Centre was organised for the students of B. Ed College at around 9.30 a.m. on the theme "People first: stop stigma and discrimination, strengthen prevention", emphasising the importance of removing obstacles without any discrimination towards drug abusers, thus providing the necessary help to ensure their physical and mental health. He spoke on the bad effects of the drug abuse and of the significance of treating drug users with respect and empathy placing a high priority on prevention, and acting with compassion.

Before and after a big meeting, she is found traversing from the dining hall to the store

A short biography of Sr. Lizy K.V.

On July 7, 2023 on the First Friday of the month at 2.30 am from 'Caritas' hospital Kottayam, Kerala our dear Sr. Lizy Varkey belonging to the Province of Sacred Heart of Jesus, Bangalore took flight to heaven. She was surrounded by the nurses and Sisters of the Community of Auxilium Puthuppally to which she belonged.

She was born on 13 June 1970 at Thodupuzha, belonged to the parish of St. Thomas Church, Mylacomb. Mr. Ouseph Varkey and Bridget Varkey were blessed with 10 children and they brought them up disciplined and God-fearing. Her father was a farmer and mother a House wife. Both of them were pious, hardworking, sincere and generous. Sr. Lizy recalls: "my father was very punctual for family prayers and he used to guide the prayers at home. He was fond of priests and religious and always talked about his experience with us. He was very strict with us at the recitation of the prayers and demanded from us discipline. He had great desire to send his children to priesthood and religious life." She continues "I learned from my family to have great trust and faith in God even in the midst of problems and difficulties. At home I had great devotion to Blessed Mother Mary and St. George."

She did her studies in Government school. She was fond of playing games. In the school she developed her talents of music, games, learned how to mingle with the children of different religion like Hindus and Muslims. The teachers helped her to study well and develop her ability to sing, and play games etc. Since she studied in Government school, she had no opportunity to discern her vocation and nobody inspired her for it. She joined the Institute after completing her Degree and worked as a trainee in a company before joining the congregation. In the year 1996 -1998 she joined the Aspirantate and did her Postulancy in Auxilium Welfare centre, Bangalore. She did her Novitiate in 1998-2000 in Sacred Heart Training Centre, Bangalore. Everything was not rosy for her; she says that during the 2nd year of the novitiate she had hard time even to the point of doubting her vocation. "The fruit of these struggles helped me to overcome the difficult situations of life in the community.

I learned to visit the families and listened to their problems. I enjoyed the Prayer moments like Eucharist and Adoration and able to experience the love and peace of the Lord," wrote Sr. Lizy. After her profession, she completed her degree. She also did Diploma Course in Social Work. The Second Novitiate was the Golden year of her life, she said. The 40 days of retreat helped so much to love Jesus in the Eucharist, enthusiasm to read and assimilate the Bible, understood the real meaning of silence, and fasting, the importance of a good confession, to recite the Rosary meaningfully etc. She could make her meditation and personal prayer without distraction and sleep.

She is very grateful to her Superiors and formators who guided her in her spiritual growth especially her Novice Mistress, Second Novitiate Mistress. She felt that she was happier and stronger in her vocation when she made her Final profession.

She began her service in the communities as a teacher and in charge of catering in Kottiyam, Kerala. She carried out her services in various communities as teacher, Catering, assistant, Sacristan, in-charge of Youth Pastoral. In most of the communities she served as Economer. Even in the last House in Puthuppally she was carrying out the service as Economer.

She was feeling a sort of uneasiness for some time and consulted the doctors and was under medication. Since she was getting weaker and losing weight, towards of the end of 2021 doctor advised an MRI scan which confirmed that she had cancer in the last stage. Shoulder bones were already affected and cancer had spread to lungs, throat etc. She underwent chemotherapy after which doctor found a little change. After receiving the Anointing of the sick in May, there was slight improvement. Sr. Lizy hoped for a cure with the medication. The whole province was praying for her, sought the intersession of Sr. Nancy Pereira and received prayers from different Centres for a miraculous cure. From June 2023 once again her condition was worsened and was admitted in the hospital. Last week once again she was administered Anointing of the Sick, prayers were intensified. Sr. Lizy hoped for a cure and wanted to live, battled for life to live for the Lord. The Lord had a different plan for her and took her to Himself alleviating her sufferings.

Her companions and other Sisters testify that she was a simple Sister, adjusting with any one and any situation. She was an endearing person, committed in her service. Sr. Lizy's selfless service to the families of Trivandrum diocese together with other Religious from 2006-2010 is commendable. The fisher folk of Puthiyathura remember her with love and gratitude for her relentless work done visiting the families and the bond of relationship she established among them. The women and children of the locality also were benefitted by her service. She was a gentle soul, lover of the poor. Whatever responsibility was entrusted to her, she accomplished it with dedication and commitment.

We are in deep sorrow at the untimely passing away of one of our Sisters. We are sure that we gained one more intercessor in heaven. Dear Sr. Lizy we commend your soul to the embrace of the Merciful Father and offer our fraternal suffrages. Intercede for the many urgent needs of the Province and pray for many vocations to our Province and to the Church.

Thank you dear Sr. Lizy

Your absence will be a void, yet you will live forever in our hearts.


